♥ My Dad passed away from Covid-19 on 27/4/20 in his care home. It was, and still is, very painful due to the circumstances that surround this pandemic we find ourselves in.

March 23rd is the anniversary of the first lockdown in the UK. Marie Curie have dedicated this day as a National Day of Reflection. It is not only to remember those taken by Covid - it is a day to reflect on our lives and how things may have changed for us over the past year. Many have lost loved ones in many different circumstances, families and friends have been estranged, jobs have been lost, home schooling, teachers having to be more brilliant than they already are! Everyone and everything has been affected in some way and we now need to start looking towards a brighter future for us all. I have managed my grief by promoting the Yellow Heart which has become recognised as a symbol to represent those who have died of Covid. I send out yellow heart pin badges and all proceeds go to a permanent physical memorial being built within St Paul's Cathedral. So, my reflection is that I grieve for my Dad, but am thankful for the support and friends I have made along the way and that there is new hope and, at last, a light at the end of a very long tunnel. ♥




Mrs Rebecca Thompson
