


Handball

Our musicians of the month are Buena Vista Social club. Buena Vista Social Club was a musical ensemble primarily made up of Cuban musicians, formed in 1996. The project was organised by World Circuit executive Nick Gold, produced by American guitarist Ry Cooder and directed by Juan de Marcos González. They named the group after the members' club of the same name in the Buenavista quarter of Havana, a popular music venue in the 1940s. Hot School Meals

We are not going to increase the charge for hot school meals at this point in time, the price will remain at £3.20 for the Autumn Term 2025.



Activity Club Price Increase – September 2025

Due to the increasing costs to the school of running our activity clubs we will be increasing the weekly charge, this will take effect from September 2025, **ALL** activity clubs will increase by 50p per week. We will maintain the 15% discount applied to all teacher led clubs to cover for unplanned cancellations.



Afterschool and Breakfast Club Price Increase – September 2025

Due to the ever increasing costs of running our afterschool and breakfast clubs we will be increasing charges as follows from September 2025:

Breakfast Club - short session - £3.70 increasing to £4.00

Breakfast Club – long session - £5.70 increasing to £6.00

Afterschool Club – full session - £12.00 increasing to £12.50

Afterschool Club – post activity club session – will remain at £9.00

We use this extra money to improve the educational provision and resources at the school and you would be helping us, if you are eligible and register.
